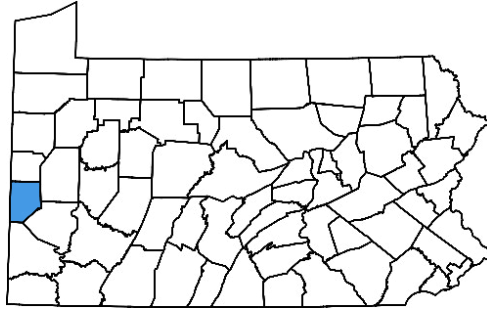




Neighborhood North Museum of Play (NNMP) is Beaver County's first children's museum where you'll find a unique space designed to foster curiosity, learning, and connection. Neighborhood North envisions our diverse communities strengthened by families through playing, making, and innovating together.

Bridging the school and home environments, the child- and family-centered play of a children's museum positively influences language, problem-solving, and socio-emotional skills, impacting children's ability to learn in all areas for years to come.

The specific mission of NNMP is to promote quality education through programming and resources.

NNMP promotes no poverty and gender equality, supporting the health of the community and its residents.

These categories are part of the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). The SDGs, established globally, provide a common framework to help organize stakeholder efforts at all levels (local, regional, national, and international) and from all sectors (government, nonprofit, corporate, and citizen) toward a more equitable and vibrant world.



The Challenge

Building a neighborhood where everyone has the chance to imagine their own future.

Beaver County has some of the highest performing school districts in the State, but it also has some of the lowest. Aliquippa, Ambridge, Big Beaver, and Rochester Area school districts, for example, have high percentages of their students scoring “below basic” on PSSA exams. And in many schools, those with learning disabilities, English language learners, or those who are economically disadvantaged do not do as well as their counterparts.

According to the National Equity Project, educational equity will be achieved when “each child receives what they need to develop to their full academic and social potential.” Contributing to this divide is inequitable funding for schools, and the fact that most resources for education are directed towards traditional schools. Yet students spend 80% of their time outside of school, which means high-quality creative out-of-school time programs like children’s museums can almost double the amount of time available for students to explore art and STEM content in experiential, collaborative learning environments. Creating a collaborative educational ecosystem that supports intergenerational learning will be at the heart of creating equity for all of our learners.

Our Impact

Playful beginnings create hopeful futures.

At Neighborhood North Museum of Play, we listen, observe, and work along-side kids and families to understand their needs and interests. We have learned that programs that are great elsewhere are not always culturally appropriate in Beaver Falls. We have a longterm vision for the Museum and our work, but have adapted to changing circumstances and needs. As strong project managers, during the pandemic, we managed 3 Learning Pod sites and developed a museum in a re-purposed space. The need for racial equity drives our work.

In 2020-21, we created more accessible education/arts opportunities for at-risk learners during COVID.

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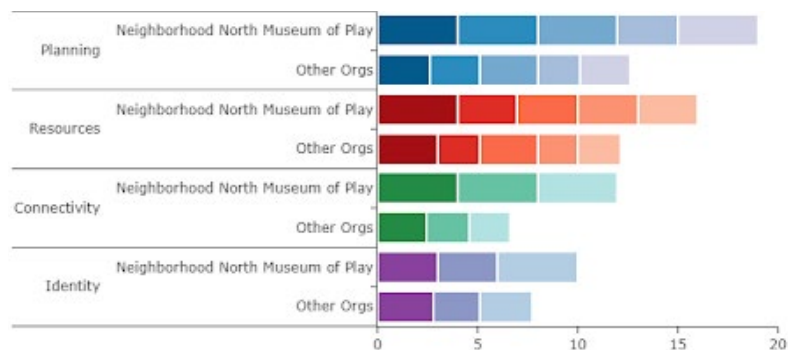

Our Capacity

How we grow together.

Located midway between Pittsburgh and Youngstown, Beaver Falls is the ideal geographic location to serve Beaver, Butler and Lawrence Counties. This fall, we have opened our preview space, Neighborhood North @The Vault, in an old bank building in the heart of downtown Beaver Falls. However, in partnership with the Beaver Falls Community Development Corporation, the long-term goal of Neighborhood North is to create a community museum/library campus that will link the Carnegie Free Library with the iconic News Tribune Building. This new educational campus will serve as a place of community connection and as a catalyst for creative learning and economic development and innovation, right in the heart of the business district.
